

Attorney-Client Privilege Protection.

Several offices have asked about the efficacy of various statements included on e-mails and faxes. While our representative on the Navy JAG Electronic Communications working group wrestles with the legal details, we do recommend using language asserting privilege on all legal communications. This example comes from our own JAL attorneys in the trenches:

The information contained in or attached to this communication is legally privileged, confidential, and intended for use only by the individual or entity to which it is transmitted.
